# PROGRESS REPORT 06

C818.01:

REHABILITATION OF 13,4 KM OF TR31 FROM ASHTON TO MONTAGU THROUGH COGMANSKLOOF

The construction work has continued after the Covid-19 Level 5 lockdown was lifted. The completion date of the project has been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and is currently expected in September 2021.

Work is currently underway in Cogmanskloof, Montagu, and Ashton. The Ashton Bridge construction, specifically the attachment of the steel cables between the arch and the deck tiebeam, is progressing well.

The Western Cape Government is working hard to maintain our roads. Please drive carefully during this period of construction. Let us work together to ensure that our roads are safe. BETTER TOGETHER.



## **CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS**

Since the previous report, the contractor has completed the following activities:

- The LHS subbase road layers from km 19.72 to 20.34, and km 22.30 to 22.50.
- The backfill at Retaining Wall W161 in Cogmanskloof.
- The installation and stressing of anchor plates on the Ashton Bridge arch.

The contractor is currently busy with the following activities: Estimated completion

- The construction of road layerworks at the Swellendam intersection.

- Construction of leiwater structures in Montagu.Stripping of falsework from the Ashton Bridge.
- Preparation for the traffic diversion onto the new Ashton Bridge in its temporary position.
- Various ancillary works, including sidewalks in Ashton, stone masonry walls in Cogmanskloof, landscape rehabilitation in Cogmanskloof, stormwater structures (pipes, inlets & outlets, concrete sidedrains, down chutes, erosion protection etc.) in Cogmanskloof, testing of services sleeves, building of service manholes throughout the project etc.

The contractor has reported that the following activities will commence during the next three months:

- Construction of road layerworks at the tunnel in Cogmanskloof.
- Final asphalt surfacing in Montagu.

### POSSIBLE DELAYS

Weather: The contractor's programme allows for normal inclement

weather days.

Materials: Even though there is an asphalt shortage at the moment, there

are currently no foreseeable delays on the project due to mate-

rial shortages.

#### **ROAD AND ACCESS CLOSURES**

- The road construction in Ashton impedes access to properties adjoining Ashton Main Road. The contractor will communicate with affected residents as the work progresses.
- The sidewalk construction in Montagu impedes access to properties adjoining Long St. The contractor will communicate with affected residents as the work progresses.
- The western entrance to Van Riebeeck St in Montagu remains closed. Access is still available via Church St.

#### GENERAL TRAFFIC ACCOMMODATION

Two-way traffic is accommodated in Ashton and Cogmanskloof with stop-go's:

- The stop-go system at the R60 turn-off to Swellendam will remain in operation until August 2020. Average delay is less than 5 minutes.
- The stop-go system in Cogmanskloof will remain in operation until 2021.
   Average delay is less than 15 minutes.
- The stop-go system in Ashton will remain in operation until July 2020. Average delay is less than 10 minutes.

#### **INTERESTING FACTS**

This construction project has created direct work opportunities for over 270 people from the Western Cape. The cumulative man-days worked by people from the local community (Ashton, Zolani, Montagu, and Ashbury) is over 35 000, resulting in a substantial amount paid in wages to the local community.
