ARCHIVAL SOURCES ON VANRHYNSDORP

The Western Cape Archives holds the memory of our province with more than 45kms of records. This flyer will help you identify *some* of the main sources of historical information available to researchers in the Western Cape Archives, specifically on Vanrhynsdorp.

1. Secretary, Divisional Council of Vanrhynsdorp (4/VRD, Inventory 3/65)

The Divisional Council was subdivided into six districts on 31 December 1891. The first meeting was held on 18 March 1892. This group of records covers the period 1891-1979 and contains:

- Council Minutes for the period
- Correspondence
- Valuation rolls
- Financial statements and ledgers
- Voters rolls
- Rates registers

2. Secretary, Village Management Board of Vanrhynsdorp (1904-1914) and Town Clerk of Vanrhynsdorp (1914-1967) (3/VRD, Inventory 3A/142)

The Village Management Board was established on 5 February 1904 and functioned until Vanrhynsdorp became a municipality on 23 April 1914.

These records include:

- Board minutes
- Financial papers, cash books and ledgers
- Real estate papers and valuation rolls

3. Magistrate of Vanrhynsdorp (1890-1976) (1/VRD, Inventory 2A/92)

Records include:

- Criminal notebooks and record books
- Inquests
- Civil cases

- Letters received (including from the Prime Minister, the Treasurer, the Under Secretary for "Native" Affairs, the Colonial Secretary, the Attorney-General, the Commissioner of Public Works and others)
- Land registers
- Apprenticeship papers
- Military papers including from WWI

4. Chief Executive Officers, West Coast Municipality (1996-2000) (4/WED, Inventory 3/121)



5. Photographs

The Western Cape Archives has over 80 000 photographs. There are photographs of Vanrhynsdorp in the AG, Fitchett, and Hopkins Collections.



6. Maps and plans

The Western Cape Archives has over 17 000 maps, plans and architectural drawings in the Cartographic Collection, including some maps related to Vanrhynsdorp.
